## READ

On the day that Jesus rose from the dead, He appeared to different people. Towards the end of the day, He appeared to two of His disciples who were walking from Jerusalem



towards Emmaus. They were talking to each other about the events of the past few days- how Jesus had been arrested and crucified, but then had been seen again alive after his burial.

While they were walking, someone joined them. The man asked them what they were discussing and they told him. Then the stranger began to tell how the old testament scriptures they had known from childhood had told them that one day all these things would take place. Now it had all happened in their lifetime to someone they knew and they had seen it for themselves.

When they arrived at Emmaus, they invited the man to eat with them. As soon as he broke the bread and asked God to bless it, they realised that this was no stranger at all- it was JESUS. They started talking to each other, "Didn't our hearts burn inside when He was telling us about the scriptures?" And then they left in a hurry to go back to Jerusalem to tell the others.

# Create

### Materials:

- Printed Road to Emmaus template
- Coloured pencils/pens
- Scissors
- Lollipop stick
- Tape

### Directions:

Step 1- Print out the template at the back of this pack.

Step 2 - Colour in the characters and picture

**Step 3-** Cut out background scene and characters.

Step 4 - Ask an adult to help you carefully cut a slit along the black line on the road.

**Step 5 -** Tape stick to back of the characters. If you dont have a lollipop stick you can use a pencil.

**Step 6-** Insert bottom of craft stick through the slot from the front.

Step 7 - Use puppet to retell the story

Now that you have heard the story of the two disciples and Jesus on the Road to Emmaus, have a think about the questions below.

- How do you think the diciples were feeling before Jesus arrived?
- How do you think the disciples felt when they found out the man was Jesus?
- Why do you think the disciples ran of to tell others?

Can you imagine how surprised the two disciples must have been? They had spent the whole afternoon with Jesus and didn't even realise!


They were so excited they didn't even stay in Emmaus that night. They walked all the way back to Jerusalem. They found the disciples and told them all that had happened.

Amen




# On the Road to Emmaus
