<p><b>Feel free to continue the activities on the previous grid. However, here are some new things to keep you amused!</b></p> <p>Teach somebody in your house the formal methods for all four operations. + - x ÷</p> <p>Design and make a fractions, decimals and percentages board game (get creative). The things you may want to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Fractions and percentages of amounts</li> <li>Converting between fractions, decimals &amp; %</li> <li>Adding and subtracting fractions</li> <li>Simplifying and expanding fractions</li> <li>Converting between improper fractions and mixed numbers.</li> <li>Adding and subtracting decimals</li> </ul> <p>Remind yourself of the different types of angles. Whilst at home or on a walk, see how many types of angles can you find? Then record what you found.</p> <p>Right angle – 90 degrees Acute angle- less than 90 degrees Obtuse angle- more than 90 degrees</p>	<p><b>Daily Reading</b> Continue to read each day. This could be anything: comic, recipes, poems, newspapers, fiction or non-fiction</p> <p><b>Reading Comprehension</b> Use the ReadTheory app regularly <a href="https://readtheory.org">https://readtheory.org</a></p> <p><b>Skimming and Scanning</b> I know how much you love this in class, why not find a text that you can colour code (for example magazine or newspaper) Colour the following ( these are some examples) : <b>Adverbs- happily, sleepily</b> <b>Personal pro-nouns- he, she, they</b> <b>Possessive pronouns- hers,theirs, mine</b> <b>Modal verbs- should, could, might, ought</b> <b>Prepositions – under, beneath, next to,tomorrow</b></p> <p><b>Create a wordsearch full of your favourite book titles and/or authors</b></p> <p><b>Make a book review for the best book you have read over the last few weeks.</b> This could be done as a poster, leaflet or video!</p>	<p><b>Recipe writing</b> I have heard that many of you have been cooking and baking. I have tried to do some with Oscar – but I am not very good at it 😞 Write and illustrate a recipe you like or have made for me to try!</p> <p><b>Explanation Leaflet</b> Think back to the debate we did on vegetarianism. Create a leaflet to share with others focusing on the impact of vegetarianism on people and the environment.</p> <p><b>Poem</b> We are all in need of a bit of fun, so to make us smile I would like you to write a poem about your time at home. Think about all the different types of poem. It would be lovely if we could share these with each other whenever we get back together!</p> <p>SPAG Superstars! Seeing as you have all become amazing at your SPAG, I thought you may like to keep on top of it and might even want to impress your family.
