Reading Books: I am sure you have read all the books sent home with you maybe you could logo on to Oxford Owl and if you have a library card you can also access online books.</p> <p>Literacy Shed: -Follow the link to the animation ‘A Cloudy Lesson’ https://www.literacyshed.com/cloudylesson.html Can you chose a writing follow up activity from the four choices below: 1-Write instructions for 'How to make clouds.' Use imperatives/ bossy verbs. 2- Write dialogue between the two (a conversation between grandson and grandpa. 3- Invent ways in which other natural phenomena are made e.g lightning, thunder, etc 4- Write a news report detailing what people saw in the sky, perhaps interview the cloud maker for explanation.</p> <p>Comprehension- Read some texts and answer questions. Encourage them to have a go/guess of the answers explaining their thoughts. Answers are attached. Try one every couple of days. Literacy shed-comprehension- age group4-7. Could you design a map of a real or imaginary place and show it as if you were looking down on it. We call this a ‘birds’ eye view’ for maps and plans. They usually have a key. It could be a plan of your house or bedroom or garden? It could be from a well-known fairy tale or book. Or even better a made-up world can you try to devise your own key for this. If you are unsure on a key why not label it instead in your neatest handwriting. With a grown see if you can find your home or our school on google earth.
