### Topic:

**Science:** On the Oak National Academy website continue to follow the series of lessons about plants. You can find this by going to their website and clicking on online lessons, then subjects, then year 3, then foundation, then scroll down to science. This week is: 'To explain how a plant transports water' and the following week is 'How do plants adapt to different conditions?' <https://www.thenational.academy/online-classroom/year-3/foundation#subjects>

**History:** Look at the BBC bitesize website and read and watch 'What was life like for the Ancient Maya?' After you have done this compare life then and now. You could do this by folding a piece of paper in half and writing about life now on one side and life then on the other (you can add drawings too), or you could write a couple of paragraphs to compare life then and now. The following week read and watch 'Why was farming so important to the Mayas?' and then make a leaflet or poster to show the three types of Maya farming.
