Share your <b>notes</b> with me in the style of a poster! Remember <b>key elements!</b></p> <p><b>Skimming and Scanning</b> I know how much you love this in class, why not find a text that you can colour code (for example magazine or newspaper) we are looking for apostrophes! <b>Possessive apostrophes</b> <b>Contractions</b></p> <p><b>Create a wordsearch full of your favourite book characters! Then ask someone in your house to complete it!</b></p> <p><b>Choose part of a book you have enjoyed. Re-create it in the style of a comic strip.</b> What could they be saying to each other? What are the characters like? How do you imagine them to look?</p>	<p><b>Tourist Brochure</b> Midhurst is a really lovely place, which at the minute we should appreciate even more. Design and write a tourist brochure explaining the history and attractions of Midhurst (for someone who doesn't know a lot about the area) You may want to include the history, landmarks, schools, restaurants etc. Remember to use eye-catching titles and subheadings, adjectives and all the other fabulous features you have learnt!</p> <p><b>Thank a community hero.</b> There are so many people out there doing their best to help keep us all safe. Write a letter to a key worker of your choice thanking them for all that they are doing. Remember how to set out a letter! Show off your skills!</p> <p><b>Explanation Leaflet</b> Think back to the debate we did on vegetarianism. Create a leaflet to share with others focusing on the impact of vegetarianism on people and the environment.</p> <p><b>Poem</b> Write any type of poem you wish! Think about the various types we have looked at. Create one using the title: Once this is all over... **Research:** Research the layers of a rainforest (there are some great videos) then present your findings in a creative way- draw, collage, paint etc
