<p>CGP Maths homework books Continue to work through CGP homework books</p> <p>TimesTables Continue to practise your times tables and related division facts up to 12 x 12 eg. 6x5=30 30 ÷ 5 = 6 How quickly can you answer questions? Can you make fact families? Don't forget to use Times Tables Rock Stars to help with speed.</p> <p>Continue to follow the white rose hub or BBC Bitesize daily maths lessons (or both as they are linked and will be the same topic each week). The white rose hub has a video for each lesson and there are 5 lessons per week. For the week beginning May 4th the topic is money which follows on from the money topic we had just started in school. Spend some time editing your writing to check you have used accurate punctuation and tense.</p> <p>To link with our science topic of plants you could do the following:</p> <p>Roald Dahl invented many preposterous plants, like the bong-bong tree that grows in Loompaland. Can you invent your own extra-usual tree, plant or flower? Draw a picture of your preposterous plant, and then give it a name and a short description. If you like, you can invent a Latin name for it too!</p> <p>Daily lessons</p> <p>The Oak National Academy are providing daily literacy lessons. Each week is a mini block. Try to take part in these over the next 2 weeks. The topics coming up are poetry and character description.</p>



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		<p>If you click on online classroom, then find lessons, then schedule, then year 3 and start with week 3 a literacy lesson on poetry called ‘Poetry: Reading comprehension, word meaning’ should come up for Monday.
