<p>- Try a daily lesson from white rose. Answer the activities after the videos. https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/</p> <p>In class this week we have been exploring time: Please could you help your children to tell the time to half past and o'clock on an analogue clock, check it if they can remember how midday and midnight are represented. Recall how many seconds in a minute, then minutes in an hour and so on. Can they order the days of the week from Monday onwards, what days are the weekend? Can they think about activities they would have attended in a normal week; rainbows, beavers, swimming. Explore the months of the year. Which months are in which season? When is their birthday?</p> <p>Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division: Review all of the four key operations. Use objects to help them to add or subtract, number lines or pictures to support learning. Q: Helen had 16 stickers and Joe gave her 7 more, how many does she have now? Billy had 28 sweets he gave 2sweets to each of his 4 friends , how many does he have now? See the free maths links as they will have a variety of questions to support their learning.</p> <p>Place Value: Every where you travel point out numbers, can they say the number and recognise which digit represents the ones, tens and hundreds. Games; Play number bingo at home. Guess my number- is my number odd, double digits, in the 5 times table.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Maths Games</p> <p>-Try a maths game to play and test your knowledge . Children can choose from 5-6, or adjust to 4-5 or 6-7 years. Reading challenge-In the holidays why not challenge yourself to reading a book, picture, non-fiction, chapter book, perhaps you could take turns reading with an adult or big brother or sister. Maybe start writing/designing a book for a younger sibling.

Maths- Can you complete your own 50, 100 square or even a 200 square? Try to spot patterns of numbers.

Science- Look at nature all around you, become an expert spotting certain trees, birds, insects or whatever interests you. Can you make a bug hotel out of recycled materials? There are lots of ideas out there.

History- Choose an item or person and learn a little about it/them. Maybe draw a picture/poster, create a timeline or video sharing the facts you have learnt. E.g: Lightbulbs, hoovers, Grace Darling, Florence Nightingale, Isambard Brunel.

Geography-Pick your favourite flag from around the world, find out something interesting about that country.

Spend some time alone where you can sit and listen to the sounds around you. What can you hear? Is it far away or nearby? Do you feel relaxed when you sit and are still?

Do you have a favourite place to be just be you, is it inside or outside?
