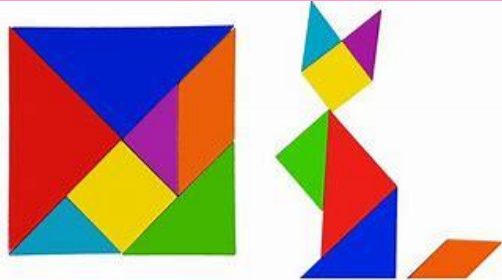

<p><b>CGP Maths homework books</b> Carry on with CGP Maths homework book (answers for marking sent home)</p> <p><b>Times Tables</b> Learn all times tables up to x12- there are many games and quiz ideas to help with this on the: <b>Twinkl School Closure Y 4 booklet.</b></p> <p><b>Key Skills</b> Progress onto learning the linked division facts (in yellow homework book) Revise doubling and halving skills. Is the time am or pm? Can you convert the time to 24 hour and vice versa? &gt; Use a dice to generate addition, subtraction, multiplication and division problems (sums). Check with a calculator. &gt; If you are cooking, try converting the measures of the recipe, e.g. 500g = ½ Kg/ 0.5Kg</p> <p><b>June 15th</b> Follow the white rose hub or BBC Bitesize daily maths lessons (or both as they are linked and will be the same topic each week). The white rose hub has a video for each lesson and there are 5 lessons per week. Write a book review for one or more of the books (blank format in book sent home) Draw a picture of a character from one of the books you've read and write a short paragraph describing the character. &gt; Read a short story , poem or short piece of information aloud to someone else – it could even be a teddy or you could record yourself. &gt; Create a reading corner somewhere in your house – it could be a bedroom, shed, whatever. - Use cushions and make yourself comfortable. Read comics, game instructions, anything you like. June 15th BBC Bitesize daily lesson are also doing reading activities. Which routine do you prefer and why? &gt; Write a diary, recording what you do every day. &gt; Write and illustrate a story book for a year 1 or reception child. - > don't forget your spelling words, what about going over them with joined up handwriting, so that you are learning and practising two things at once?

Computing - Practise your typing by logging on to BBC Dance Mat's typing game.

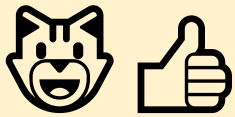
Craft – make a mask using a paper plate.
