Thursday's fire

I'm not often lost for words, but it is hard to start a newsletter in the usual way after yesterday's devastating fire in North Street. This has impacted so many of our families within our wider school community in so many ways. Homes, businesses and jobs have been lost and the whole town will be grieving the devastation of such old, historical buildings that added to the high streets character. It's all so sad. But, as ever, the Midhurst community acted with speed, kindness, love and care, offering donations immediately to help those with nothing. This was true of our own school community too - it was a very emotional day. I am aware that there are crowd fund pages for people to donate money to support both the Ukrainian families, alongside those local people who have also lost everything and from what I have already seen people are being incredibly generous with their donations. Obviously at school we will continue to do anything and everything we can to support all families affected by this tragedy – but if there is anything anyone thinks we might be able to help with, or knows someone in need who is not finding it easy to ask for support, then please do get in touch. We will always do what we can, or signpost people to others who may be able to help. Meanwhile, let's all try to be kind, patient (especially round the country lanes!) and look after each other as we all attempt to recover from this terrible event.

Last week's update:

It has been a busy week with lots of outings and visits – read on to find out more and lots of photos below!

On Monday I was lucky enough to be invited on the Year 2 trip to the RSPB site at Pulborough Brooks, a trip which was very kindly funded by the Midhurst and Petworth Rotary Club. In the morning, everyone learnt about 'Brilliant Birds', with lots of hands-on games and activities. We learnt about different bird's feathers, played a busy bird survival game, made nests using clothes pegs as our beaks and did some bird spotting.

In the afternoon, everyone became plant detectives, learning all about the parts of a plant and their function, identifying and recording plants and trees, and creating our own plants using natural materials.

We were joined by a couple of representatives from the Rotary Club who commented on how engaged and well-behaved the children were. It was a very blustery, fun-filled day. Thanks again to the Rotary Club for their generosity.



On Tuesday Year 3 walked down to MRC to take part in the ALL SING event with other primary schools from across the locality. The children learnt some songs and enjoyed singing them altogether. They also learnt a rap and added extra sound with body percussion too! A great time was had by all – many thanks to MRC for organising and hosting and to Mrs Alden and Ms Rose for taking the children down.

I was back out in the minibus again picking up some of our Year 4 children who had spent the day at the Weald and Downland with Year 3. Judging from the chatter on the bus everyone had a fantastic day



exploring all the houses and learning about different times in history. Year 4 enjoyed a workshop all about Tudor games, even trying some out! Year 3 learnt all about Tudor apothecary in their workshop, they made a pomander and discovered Tudor treatments for common diseases. Apparently, it was common to strap a frog to your neck to soothe a sore throat and place fox or rabbit intestines in your ear to ease deafness!! Suddenly, the usual Amoxicillin treatment doesn't seem so bad after all!! Both classes had a great time, learning lots and even managed to miss the rain too!

On Thursday, Years Five and Six enjoyed a PSHE themed performance at school. They gained an insight into the history of our NHS along with the many areas and job roles that exist within this huge service. This was an opportunity to inspire future careers alongside gaining an understanding of just how broad the services are on offer within our NHS.

Thursday evening saw the second of our two parents' evenings – many thanks to everyone who made an appointment and came along to talk to the teachers and



look at children's work. I always enjoy seeing you all, chatting to many and I know the teachers appreciate your time too. We are aware there were some people who were unable to make their appointment due to



the road closure in the high street – please do get in touch with the school office, or directly with the class teacher to make a new appointment when things are easier. We are always keen to see you.

Chartwells – Parent Pay activation!

Many thanks to all parents who have activated their ParentPay account to order hot meals from Chartwells. I gather 59 pupil accounts have been activated so far which is great! 
