### Last week's update:

Another hot week for everyone – although it is lovely to see the sunshine and it definitely makes outdoor events like todays Summer Fair much easier and more enjoyable for all. Thanks for all the jars, cakes and other donations offered - we are very much looking forward to seeing you all later!

But before then a speedy round up of this week's events!

On Monday Year 3 had their first trip to Iping Common to work with Ryan from Sussex Wildlife towards earning their John Muir award. In order to get this award, they need to learn about their local environment, how to look after and protect this and share it with others. During the day they did a wildlife treasure hunt, went bug hunting, built dens for animals and played a fun game called bat and moth. They then have been doing follow up work in class and are becoming experts on the plants and animals you can find on Iping common. The day was brilliant, the children were very engaged and they are already excited about the next trip in July. More pics below On Tuesday children were invited to wear their own clothes in exchange for a donation of 50p or more towards the Family Support Work charity run by the Diocese, which is how our lovely Kirsty is funded who works with many families at MPS. We were overwhelmed with your generosity and I am delighted to share that we are now able to offer a donation of £200 from the MPS community during the Y6 leavers service on Monday – which is just AMAZING! Many many thanks to you all.

Our three Y6 school councillors were lucky enough to join other locality schools for a trip to the Chichester council chambers at County Hall. They started with a picnic lunch in the Bishops Palace Gardens and then went across to County Hall where they had a tour before experiencing the actual council chambers, sitting in the big chairs and learning how to use the microphones to share their thoughts. The children then experienced a serious debate about whether or not the government should fund climate change initiatives. Archie, Leila and James enjoyed the whole experience – especially using the microphones – it certainly gave them an interesting insight into politics!! Huge thanks to Mrs Simpson who kindly gave up her time to take the children along.







Miss Hurrion had hot afternoon in the woods this week with the group enjoyed adding to their dens. Apparently one of the dens had multiple rooms which was very impressive! A swing was added and enjoyed by many, while others toasted marshmallows over traceless fires. Miss Leavens also showed a couple of children how to do macramé. By all accounts it was a lovely session and the children are looking forward to trying out many more new activities in their woods sessions when they next go along in Year 3.
