





IS THERE A PROVEN LINK BETWEEN ATTENDANCE AND YOUR CHILD'S ACHIEVEMENT IN SCHOOL?



Yes! There is a clear link between poor attendance at school and lower academic achievement.

Did you know – a two-week holiday in term time means that the highest attendance you can achieve is 94.7%

Did you know – if you are 15 mins late to school every day you will have missed 2 full weeks of school in 1 year.

Of the children who miss more than 50 per cent of school, only 3% manage to achieve five or more GCSEs at grades A* to C. 73% of

children who have over 95% attendance achieve five or more GCSEs at grades A* to C. While GCSEs may seem some time away, setting good attendance and punctuality patterns from Reception through to Year 6, will really help.

MPS OFF TO A FLYING START!



On Friday 13th (unlucky for some – but not us!) Mrs Alden and I were lucky enough to take two teams of footballers down to MRC for the annual Rother Valley tournament. Incredibly, our Midhurst 1st team managed to win the entire tournament through skill, teamwork and bravery! We played Easebourne, Harting and Stedham in the group stages, winning against the latter two 1-0 courtesy of goals from Sylvester and Mylo and two beautiful pinpoint assists from Libby.

Our first game against Easebourne ended in a 1-1 draw (another Sylvester goal) and as we were tied for first in the group; we had to play a dramatic golden goal game. 




Joseph Coelho - Poetry Prompt
