Christ came into the world that all may have life and have it in all its fullness – John 10v10





Congratulations to Mr Ind's Class, Year 5, for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 293 points. Go Year 5!




Congratulations also to Red House who are in the lead with 2848 points!

### **FOREST SCHOOL**

Central to our ethos at Midhurst is Forest School, an approach to learning that incorporates children's right to play, to access the outdoor environment and to feel success. It enables supported risk taking, child centred learning, exploration, and play. It enables a unique way of building independence and self-esteem in young children, exposing them to the natural world at a time where it is vital for children to understand their impact on the environment.







Our children take part in forest school sessions twice a week with our older children visiting our own dedicated area of woodland near Woolbeding ably led by our Forest Schools leaders Mrs Alden and Mrs Cain, whilst our younger children remain on site in our own forest school area in school with Miss Channon. This week our children have been taking part in Den Building and cooking Toffee Apples!

## FIU VACCINATIONS - FRIDAY 1st DECEMBER 2023

Reminder information re: Year R-6 Influenza (FLU) vaccinations

The Immunisation Service are coming into school on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December to offer your child the Year R-6 Influenza (FLU) vaccinations. You will have already received an email from school with the following information:

- A parent letter with instructions on how to complete the online consent form, to either
  consent or refuse this course of vaccinations. This letter also contains your schools unique
  Cinnamon school code, which you will require in order to submit your child's consent form.
  Please note there is a cut off time and date for consent completion, which can be found in
  the letter. This also contains important information on the vaccines and frequently asked
  questions, to help you and your child reach an informed decision regarding consent.
- Influenza leaflet from Public Health England to be shared with your child.
- The online consent form is available for completion until 11am four working days before the 1st December. However, if you have any difficulties completing this online form, please contact your local Immunisation team before the cut-off date, using the telephone number provided in the attached letter or below. If you miss the cut off time to complete the consent form, you will be able to call the immunisation team on 01273 696011 ext. 8100

where you can give verbal consent. We will not be able to vaccinate your child in school on the day of the vaccination session if no consent has been given.

## MRC HOCKEY TOURNAMENT




