And lastly thank you to you all. Thank you for the support and encouragement you have shown me during my first term.


May I, on behalf of everybody here, wish you all a happy and restful Christmas and a peaceful new year.



Congratulations to Year 5, for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 933 points. Go Year 5!




Congratulations also to Red House who remain in the lead with 4531 points!

#### YEAR 4 EAR DEFENDERS







Year 4 have designed and made ear defenders as part of their science topic on sound. They made choices on which materials to use. They drew around a template, cut out their design and then went to the filling station. This is where they used their knowledge to decide which materials would be more sound proof. They had bubble wrap, foam, small pieces of felt and fabric. Some children combined their fillings others used different stuffing for each side. They then carried out a noise pollution test to see which ear defenders were the best.


