KFFP OUR CHILDREN SAFE

I want to spend a little time talking about a game many of our children are playing online. Obviously, if your child is not playing this, then please ignore this and accept my apologies.

The game in question is called Fortnite. It is a free online survival game, in its basic form, with players working together on various missions against an enemy that are trying to kill them.

Despite Fortnite having a PEGI rating of 12, many of our children have been playing this game online. We are aware that for some families this is causing issues at home as the children try to assure their parents that 'everyone is playing it' and that they don't want to be the only one not allowed. We are concerned that not all parents will understand what the game involves and so we are attaching some information which you might find useful when deciding whether or not your child should play the game.

You will, of course, make your own decisions about this for your child. However, should you decide to ignore the 12+ age restriction, can we urge you to sit with your child at some point when Fortnite is on the screen and to keep an eye on how your child is behaving online towards others, who is in their shared online community at any given time and how they are behaving towards your child.

Currently, staff in school are spending time with some children each day, dealing with the emotional fallout from having played Fortnite the previous evening. When they are playing as teams, if one member of the team has to stop playing for whatever reason, or makes a mistake, it has an impact on their mood in school and how they interact with each other in school. We're sure that you will be as anxious as we are to limit the issues that are arising from this game to an absolute minimum.

Please do take the time to have a read of the following guidance on Fortnite which will give you the facts about the game. Whilst we are certainly not experts on the game, if you have any questions or want to discuss any further, please do pop in.



A REMINDER ABOUT THE WRAPAROUND CARE WEST SUSSEX PARENTS SURVEY

The national wraparound childcare programme is part of the childcare reforms announced at the 2023 Spring Budget

The government's ambition is that by 2026, all parents and carers of primary school-aged children who need it will be able to access term time childcare in their local area from 8.00am to 6.00pm, so that parents can access employment and improve labour market participation.

To support this ambition, the government announced that it will provide start-up funding over two academic years to support local authorities and providers in England to introduce or expand childcare provision on either side of the school day, which parents of primary school-aged children will be able to pay to access.

As part of the Local Authorities statutory duties around sufficiency we are required to understand the supply and demand of childcare places and any gaps in provision, including how these gaps will be addressed.

We are looking for views from all parents and carers of children aged 0-14 years (and up to 18 for children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) about how you currently use childcare, and how this may continue to change in the future.

To support this knowledge and understanding it is important that we include the voice of the families so we can better understand if the childcare available is meeting your needs.

The questions and length of the survey will vary depending on the age of your child/children but should take no more than 10 minutes to complete. Importantly your feedback will help us to shape improvements to the future of childcare delivery in West Sussex and support the availability of childcare provision to meet continuing demand.





Congratulations to Birch Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 285 points. Well done Birch Class!




Arun House have taken the lead this week from Rother House with 826 points!


