Happy New Year! Welcome to the spring term. It is great to have everyone back after an exciting Christmas break.

This term the topic being studied by Maple and Beech class. (Years 3 and 4) is **'Life on the Edge.'** Below is a brief outline of our areas of study:

In addition, maths and literacy lessons will be taught daily (linked to our topic work when appropriate).



The children will have regular reading sessions, as well as other opportunities to practise reading skills by reading to adults in school. When you hear your child read at home, please remember to write in the red log book. They will earn stickers and every 10 reads at home earn them golden time! I have also asked the children to write in their log book if they read to themselves at home. We will have a class book that I will read to them daily and it would be great if you read to your child too. Please encourage your child to read everything around them. Road signs, cookery books, comics, you can even put the text on your television. The more they read the broader their vocabulary.



The children will continue to have regular spellings on Spelling Frame and times tables to learn on Ttrockstars. Passwords and user names are in the red homework book. The red homework books



will be sent home on a Wednesday and will need to be returned back to school on Monday morning.

Times tables will be tested on Tuesdays as all year 4 children are required by the Government to a times tables check in June. More information to follow in the Summer Term.



Spellings will be checked on Monday afternoon and new spellings will be set.

There will be homework tasks set online on Seesaw on Wednesdays this will be linked to the work we are doing in class. Please let me know if you need a copy of your child's seesaw code.

The children will have two P.E. lessons per week. We will be having Aspire for P.E. on Tuesdays, and on Thursdays this first half term year 4 will be swimming. Can your child please bring their PE kit in on Monday ready for the week ahead. After half term we will return back to PE on a Friday.
