Happy Friday Everyone! I hope you all had a restful half term break. Now I am back to school, can I thank you all for your kind thoughts and wishes during my time away. Can I also take the opportunity to thank both Mrs Chance and Mr Ind who led the school so superbly in my absence.

As I am sure you all know, access to the school site at pick up and drop off times continues to be an issue. The issues are manifold. Firstly, I am concerned that we still do not have a designated crossing patrol on Bepton Road. I have had reports of a number of near misses as our children and families have crossed and cars have either failed to stop or, furthermore, not kept to the speed limit. Your safety and the safety of our children is our utmost priority. We have made representations to the council and voiced our concerns but we need to gain some more traction for our concerns to meet a resolution. At committee level, our Health and Safety governors will be taking a lead in seeking a safe solution to the current unsafe situation and to that end I would ask for your thoughts in order to make our case stronger. In the short term, I would ask you please to email your thoughts and concerns to our Health and Safety governor for your child's safety would make our case extremely strong. In the meantime I would ask you and your child to be extremely careful when crossing Bepton Road but also be mindful of crossing issues when parking on the verges of Bepton Road during pick up and drop off. This can exacerbate the problem.

Unfortunately, I also have to write to express the schools, local residents and parents concerns about illegal and unsafe parking around school. This is an ongoing problem and we would like your support in addressing it. Please consider parking away from the school and walking. We know time is precious and everyone is busy but the children are also precious. It is only a matter of time before a parent in a hurry to drop off their child and get on with their day, results in a serious injury or worse.

Children are increasingly at risk where parents 'double park' blocking others which results in children getting out of cars in an unsafe area.

The approach road to school is demarcated by yellow zig zag lines. Please can we remind drivers not to use the yellow zig-zag lines at the times stated on the signs. We have asked a number of times that cars do not park here. Parking on double yellow lines is illegal. A number of our local residents have also come into school to report cars parked across, and sometimes in, their driveways at drop off and pick up time. Please also respect the driveways of our neighbours as they have been blocked in by cars. The private road running from the left of the school approach road and Bepton Road is a private road and should not be used by vehicles.

The car park is for authorised staff vehicles only. If drop off is required please email the school office on <u>office@midhurstprimary.co.uk</u> to organise this facility where you will be issued with a permit for drop off.





Congratulations to Pine Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 253 points. Well done Pine Class!




