MPS - CROSS-COUNTRY REPORT by MRS ALDEN

On Friday 2nd February myself, Mr. Jones, Mrs. Griffiths and Mrs. Berry took our 43 (!) strong cross-country team to compete in the MRC Sports Partnership cross-country races. This competition is the 4th event in the League, and after coming 1st and 2nd in 2 of the previous events, we were keen to place highly and give ourselves a chance of retaining our title of overall champions.

The team consisted of children from Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 who have all been training very hard since before Christmas for this event. I have been so

pleased with how many children have taken part in this club and we had the biggest team by a long way.

The first competition was the Year 3 and 4 girls race who got us off to a flying start with Lucy Hutchings winning the race and the team winning the team race! This was followed by the Year 3 and 4 boys' race where we had another individual winner with Harry Clark crossing the line first. The next 2 races were the Year 5, and 6 girls race and the Year 5 and 6 boys' race. These races are selection races with the top 5 in each year group being selected to represent mid-Sussex in the Sussex County finals in March. In the Year 5 and 6 girls race it was again an MPS shirt which crossed the line first with Poppy Alden winning this race. There was also team success with the Year 5 and 6 girls team finishing 2nd. I am very proud to report that, from this race, we had 4 runners selected to represent mid-Sussex. This is a fantastic achievement, and we are so proud that 4 children out of a team of 10, are from MPS. Well done to Libby Porter, Miley Padginton, Poppy Alden and Frances

In the Year 5 and 6 boys race the boys showed how well good team packing pays off. A group of them were very close together and their team ended up finishing 2nd.

After all the races there was the presentation to find out which school was the winner. This was a nervous wait as the competition involved 9 other schools and some of these school also had very strong teams. Camelsdale finished in 3rd place, Hollycombe in 2nd place and, I am delighted to say, we finished in 1st place! This is an amazing, and very well-deserved result. Our team have trained hard and showed incredible determination and teamwork. Cross country is a tough sport physically and physically and requires bravery – all the team have this in spades. Each one of you tried your very best, represented the school brilliantly and contributed to our victory. We are incredibly proud of you.

Safer Internet Day 2024 took place on the 6th of February 2024, with celebrations and learning based around the theme 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence, and navigating change online'.









REWARD POINTS

Congratulations to Pine Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 371 points. Well done Pine Class!




Arun House are in the lead this week with 1929 points!


