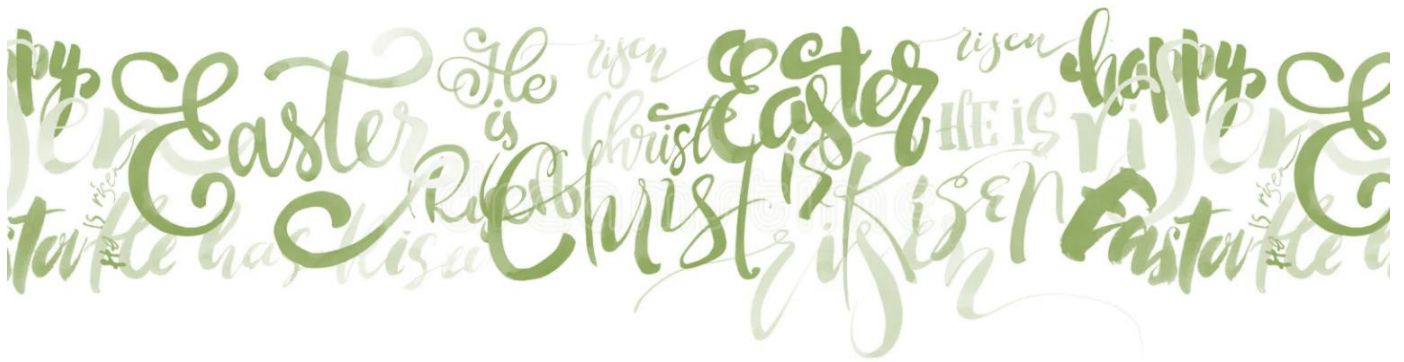




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# ~~THURSDAY~~ FRIDAY FLYER

## ARRANGEMENTS FOR PE KIT FROM NEXT TERM

## NSPCC's SPEAK OUT – STAY SAFE PROGRAMME

All children took part in NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme this week. Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom-based activities, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children aged 6-7 and 9-11. The content was delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. ## IMMUNISATIONS REMINDER

West Sussex County Council have asked us to communicate with our parents who may have children starting school in September. Please make sure that your child is up to date with all their routine immunisations before joining school. If you are not sure if your child has had all their routine vaccinations, check their personal health record (Red Book) or contact the GP surgery. The pre-school immunisations – often called pre-school boosters – will update or top up your child's level of

antibodies (which their bodies produce to fight off disease and infection) and help to keep them protected.

Protection (immunity) against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough and polio from the immunisations given to babies can fade over time. Sometimes, complete immunity to measles, mumps or rubella does not develop after a single dose of the MMR vaccine – so this gives them a second chance. Measles cases are rising in England – all children starting or returning to school are at risk of catching measles if they are not fully protected.
