As I write this I am waiting for one of our County Councillors to come in to school and meet with myself and Andy Scott, our Health and Safety Governor, to go through the issues and make sure the safety of our children is represented at Council level at the earliest opportunity. I happen to know that a zebra crossing has been proposed on Bepton Road which, if passed, could mean an extra entrance to the school on the Bepton side of the school perimeter. This would be fantastic. I will keep you updated as and when I hear anything.



Also, due to the amazing hard work of Andy, Chichester District Council, have agreed a parking permit scheme for our parents. #### **PE KIT**

Thank you for working with us and sending your children to school in PE kit on those days that they have PE. It certainly maximises lesson time minimising the time where children would be changing. #### **SLAP CHEEK SYNDROME**

You will know I sent a letter to you all yesterday informing you of a number of confirmed cases of Slapped Cheek Syndrome in school. Since yesterday, we have had another three cases confirmed bringing the total of confirmed cases this week up to six.

Slapped Cheek is a viral infection most common in children, although it can affect people of any age. It usually causes a bright red rash on the cheeks. Although the rash can look alarming, slapped cheek syndrome is normally a mild infection that clears up by itself in one to three weeks. Symptoms of slapped cheek syndrome usually develop 4-14 days after becoming infected, but sometimes may not appear for up to 21 days.

#### Initial symptoms

Some people with slapped cheek syndrome won't notice any early symptoms, but most people will have the following symptoms for a few days:

- a slightly high temperature (fever) of around 38C (100.4F)
- a runny nose
- a sore throat
- a headache
- an upset stomach
- feeling generally unwell

The infection is most contagious during this initial period. In order to prevent the spread of illness, please keep your child off school if they show any of these symptoms until they feel better and seek medical advice if needed. A rash may develop but if they feel well enough they can return to school.

Please also let us know if your child has these symptoms or has been confirmed as having slapped cheek syndrome by a GP. This virus can be more serious for some people e.g. if pregnant, have a blood disorder or a weakened immune system so the NHS recommends seeking medical advice if people in these groups come into contact with children with slapped cheek syndrome. 
#### **EVERY CHILD NEEDS A FAMILY. DO YOU HAVE A SPACE IN YOURS?**




