Once again, Happy Friday Everyone and welcome to this week's Friday Flyer!

What a busy week we've had! On Monday and Tuesday of this week Beech Class children were out of school on a residential at PGL Marchants Hill near Hindhead. It is absolutely essential that your child is in school during this week and on time as the exams will start promptly in the morning. Please ensure that they are well rested and have eaten a good breakfast as this will allow them to do the best that they can. Please also note that after the SATs have finished, the Year 6 pupils will continue to sit assessments in preparation for the transition to their new school and therefore they must continue to attend school as normal.

During the two days the children were supported by the fabulous PGL team. The different instructors shared their skills and knowledge with the children. Our team leader Yoshi ensured that we got to and from each activity and looked after us really well.



PARKING AT THE GRANGE CAR PARK



Congratulations to Beech Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 229 points. Well done Beech Class!


