BEECH CLASS GET HANDS ON WITH BREAD

We are excited to share the wonderful learning experiences happening in Year 4's Design and Technology lessons! This term, our young designers have been exploring the art and science of bread making. Through hands-on activities, they have discovered the importance of ingredients, techniques, and the cultural significance of bread around the world.

What We've Been Learning:

- The different types of bread and their origins.
- The key ingredients needed to make bread and their roles.
- The science behind yeast and how it helps bread rise.
- The importance of kneading and proving to achieve the perfect texture.
- Designing our own bread recipes and experimenting with flavours and shapes.

Exciting Activities:

- Tasting and comparing different types of bread.
- Following a recipe to make our own dough from scratch.
- Observing how yeast reacts and causes the dough to rise.
- Baking our handmade bread and evaluating the results.

Home Challenge! We encourage families to continue the bread-making fun at home! Try baking a simple loaf or experimenting with different ingredients. Your child can share their homemade bread and discuss the process with the class.

OAK CLASS AT ISLE OF WIGHT




OCOFFEE & CROISSANT CHANGE OF DATE

Congratulations to Pine Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 518 points. Well done Pine Class






Rother House remain in the lead this week with 7943 points so far this year.


