Happy Friday Everyone!

As we approach the end of the school year, we are beginning preparations for the new academic year ahead. I would like to take this opportunity to inform you of some staff changes that will be taking place within our teaching team.

Each year, we review our staffing structure to ensure we continue to provide the best possible education and support for our children. As part of this process, some of our teachers will be moving to different year groups from September.

These changes are part of our ongoing professional development and school improvement plan, allowing staff to broaden their experience, share expertise across the school, and continue to grow in their roles. We are confident that these changes will bring fresh ideas and renewed energy to each year group, while maintaining consistency and high standards across the school.

Below is a summary of the teacher movements:

These sessions will remain free of charge if you are accessing benefits related free school meals. Each session will include a free nutritious meal.





Congratulations to Birch Class for gaining the most Reward Points this week with 277 points. Well done Birch Class




Rother House remain in the lead this week with 12604 points so far this year. Closely followed by Lavant House on 12446 points.

PTA Sponsored Colour Run

This year, we have decided to add a sponsored colour run at our Summer Fair which we think the kids will love!

A lot of you have been asking 'what is a colour run?'



A colour run is a fun run with a difference - participants are showered with brightly coloured powder at various points along the course. It's designed to be a social and enjoyable event rather than a competitive race, emphasizing the experience of being covered in colour.

Participants often wear white or light T-shirts to make the colours look even better!

Colour runs are non-competitive, meaning participants focus on enjoying the experience rather than their finishing time.

Coloured Powder Stations

Throughout the course, there are designated stations where participants are showered with non-toxic, brightly coloured powder thrown into the air as they pass. Parents are welcome to join in the throwing of the powder too!



The powders used in colour runs are typically made from non-toxic

ingredients like corn starch and food-grade dyes, however if you are concerned about skin irritation or if your child is asthmatic, please do speak to school about your concerns. If we have children who cannot take part in the coloured runs, we will do a non-powder throwing lap too.

We will have some spare sunglasses for the children to borrow if they do not have their own.

Swimming goggles can also be used to protect their eyes. If you do not have a white T-shirt, they are welcome to wear any of their own dothes to take part.

Fundraising

Children taking part can ask family and friends to sponsor them to complete the colour run challenge, raising money for the PTA which will be used to support future events like the Winter Funday and contributing toward school trips and pantomimes etc.

The colour run will start at 3.30pm.

Our school swimming lessons will give your children the confidence to swim unaided. We offer group sessions or private tuition for children of all abilities from school year R upwards. Our swimming instructors are highly qualified, experienced, and passionate about teaching water safety and swimming skills.

They create a supportive and fun learning environment, ensuring that each child gains confidence in the water while progressing at their own pace.
