After nearly four years of growing his hair, Cameron made the wonderfully selfless decision to give it up so it can be turned into a real hair wig for a child or young person who has lost their hair due to cancer treatment or conditions such as Alopecia. This was such a brave and generous thing to do, and we are all immensely proud of him for making such a meaningful difference to someone else's life.

Alongside donating his hair, Cameron set himself a fundraising goal of £800 to help cover the cost of turning his hair into a wig. The Little Princess Trust provides these wigs free of charge to children and young people, as well as funding vital childhood

**RELATIONSHIPS, HEALTH AND WELLBEING EDUCATION AT OUR SCHOOL** We would like to share an update with parents and carers about **Relationships, Health and Wellbeing Education (RSHE)** in primary schools. RSHE has been a statutory part of the curriculum since 2020, and **updated national guidance will come into effect from September 2026**. The changes strengthen children’s **safety, wellbeing and understanding of healthy relationships**, while remaining **fully age-appropriate** and sensitive to children’s needs.

### **What will children learn?**

At primary age, RSHE focuses on helping pupils to:

- Build kind, respectful friendships
- Understand feelings and emotions, including managing worries and changes
- Learn about personal safety, including road, water and online safety
- Develop confidence to say no, ask for help and talk to a trusted adult
- Understand that families and friendships can look different

### **Online safety and wellbeing**

The updated guidance places greater emphasis on helping children:

- Stay safe when using the internet and digital devices
- Understand why some apps, games and websites have age limits
- Recognise unsafe situations and know how to seek help

### **Safeguarding and body awareness**

As part of keeping children safe, pupils may:

- Learn the correct names for body parts, taught sensitively and appropriately
- Talk about personal boundaries and privacy
- Learn how to recognise when something doesn’t feel right and what to do

This supports our wider safeguarding responsibilities and helps children communicate confidently.

### **Working closely with parents**

We are committed to transparency and partnership with families. Parents have the right to:

- See our RSHE policy
- View lesson materials
- Ask questions or raise concerns

**SEND REFORM IN WEST SUSSEX – YOU NEED TO MAKE YOUR VOICE HEARD** West Sussex County Council is already planning what SEND Reform **will** look like locally over the coming years. These plans are being developed **now** for West Sussex.

If families don't speak up at this stage, decisions risk being made without truly understanding real life experiences of SEND in West Sussex.

By completing this survey, you are telling West Sussex County Council:

- What is working well for you and your child,
- What is not working and causes stress or delay,
- And what **MUST** change to improve support in the future.

This feedback will be used directly to inform local SEND Reform planning **happening now in West Sussex**.

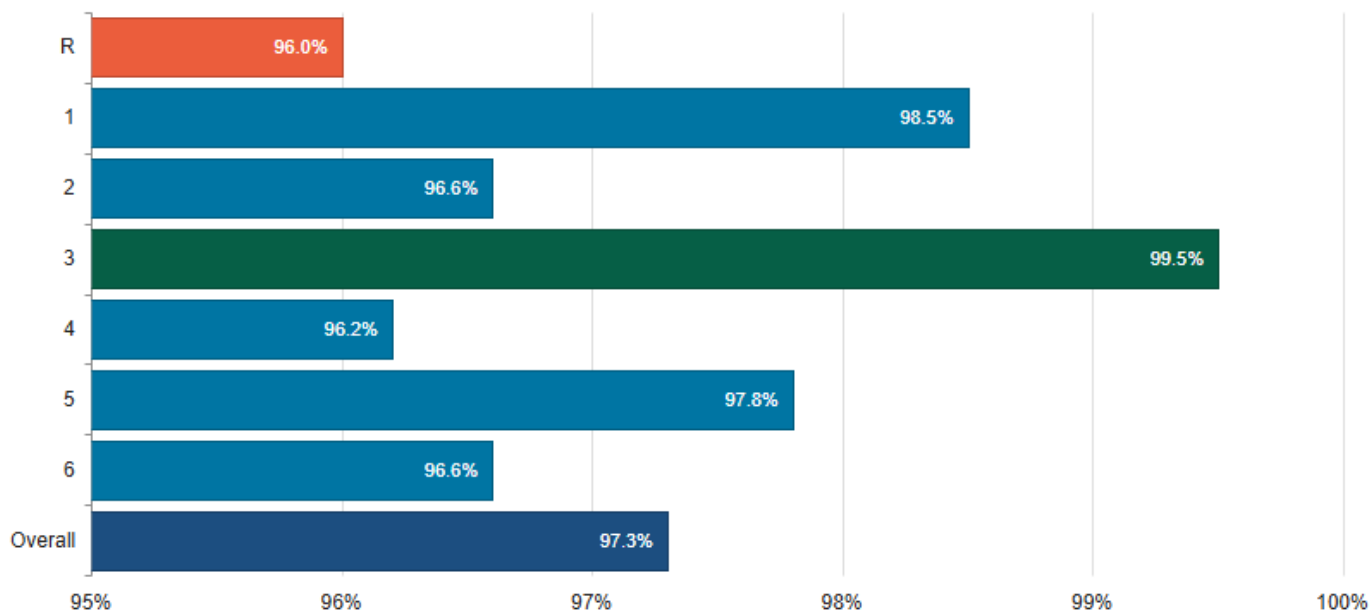
